Message from our Principal, Justin Perriam

I hope you all had a good Easter break. It's hard to believe we're nearly at the end of the first term!

On behalf of all Tuia Burnside staff I would like to express our deepest sympathies to both our Malaysian and Taiwanese communities after the recent tragic incidents. We were saddened to first hear of the loss of life of the Malaysian students in the car crash near Pukaki, followed by the damage and loss of life caused by the large earthquake in Taiwan.

Our thoughts and prayers are with every family member, friend, and fellow student who has been affected by these heartbreaking events.

End of the day pickup



Important Reminders


- **Swimming Lessons** at Jellie Park are through to Friday 12th April. So please remember to pack your child/s swimming togs & towel each day.

- Term 2 starts Monday 29th of April 8.55am.


Kāhu 2


Kahu 2 have been blowing us away with their creative ideas in writing this term. We have had some wonderful pieces of work created in class showing what fantastic ideas they have.
