

#### **Facts about Sharks**


Did you know that there are 500 species of sharks?

Sharks eat dolphins, krill, whales, tuna and little fish. Sharks can smell a tiny bit of blood in the sea nearly 5 kilometers away.

The great white shark is the largest predatory fish on the Earth, it is around 4.6 meters long and weighs about 1360 kilograms.

Some sharks like to live in hot water and rivers they like to go in deep water. Some sharks like to live in cold water too but most of them don't.





#### **Sharks**

Hammerhead Sharks eat stingrays and trap them with their wide head on the seafloor. They also eat bony fish and other sharks, fish, crabs, squid and lobsters.

They can live up to thirty years old. Hammerhead Sharks like to live in warm, tropical water.

Baby sharks are called pups and they can swim as soon as they are born. Did you know that sharks can swim even when they are sleeping?
